The Chilean Visual Arts Group (CVAG) aims to promote Chilean visual art in the United Kingdom, highlighting the work of Chilean artists and fostering collaboration among them and their counterparts of interest. This initiative seeks to enhance cultural exchange between both countries, boost Chile's image abroad, and position the country as an attractive destination for investment and tourism.

In 2022, the Embassy of Chile in the United Kingdom convened various Chilean representatives of contemporary visual arts residing in the UK. The original purpose of this meeting was to establish a working committee tasked with analyzing the challenges facing their artistic development in the region. The initial goal was to generate responses and solutions to these concerns in collaboration with the embassy and ProChile.

Following the initial meeting, the first of a series of monthly gatherings took place in October of that year at the embassy's facilities. These meetings have continued regularly since then, with the group expanding and welcoming new members. Comprising 18 professionals in the visual arts, including painters, sculptors, performers, photographers, new media artists, researchers, and art managers, the group demonstrates a commitment to advancing the professional internationalization of Chilean creative industries, with a specific focus on contemporary visual art in the significant city of London. This initiative is the result of direct communication and collaborative efforts among artists, the embassy, and ProChile.

This catalogue presents the active members of the Chilean Visual Arts Group, all of whom regularly attend meetings and participate in the group's efforts to collaborate and create a platform for Chilean visual arts in the UK.



MARCO BIZZARRI








2. Still standing (Sunlight)







Chilean artist Otto Schade moved to England in 2006, transitioning from architecture to urban sculpture and ultimately surreal painting. Influenced by Dali, Magritte, and others, he embraced street art in London's Shoreditch area in 2009, earning the moniker Osch. His work, featuring anti-war themes and his signature ribbon style, gained international acclaim, leading to participation in renowned festivals like Upfest and exhibitions worldwide, including Tokyo, Miami, and Paris. Schade's art continues to captivate audiences globally, showcasing his talent and unique perspective on urban landscapes and societal issues.
